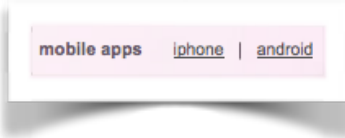




Buzz – the DKG app



The DKG App is a very helpful tool, especially for those attending the International Convention. If you have not already done so, it is time to download this app and learn how to use it. This app is useful even if you are not going to the convention.

In the bottom section of the Society website, there are links to preview/download either the iPhone or Android version of the app. Both are a free download from their respective app stores.

The DKG App has more great features than space allows us to discuss. Browse around the app for yourself. By tapping on the **Schedule** icon you will find the convention **Schedule at a Glance**, descriptions and locations of the **Breakout Sessions, Tours, and Favorites**. As you scroll through the list of breakout sessions, tap a star to add the session to your **Favorites**. Tapped Favorites will show up under **My Schedule**.

Tapping the **Maps** icon will lead to a page of maps including Austin and Indianapolis. You will also find a map of the convention hotel layout. This feature is especially great if you have good eyesight or, if you are viewing the maps on an iPad, the map can be enlarged for eyes that need a little help. This feature is very helpful when navigating the hotel!

Under the **More** icon you will find a **QR** code scanner, a **Postcard** image for convention selfies, the **DKG Store** and **Videos**.

You will find that the DKG App is a very useful tool!

The Buzz about dkg.org!

Have you explored the many useful features on our **Society website dkg.org**? If not, it is time to “buzz” around the site and learn about its many great resources. At the very top of the landing (Home) page, you will find the main links. Each of the four main links can be clicked on to visit a gateway page, or you can point your cursor over one of the main links to see a drop-down menu of links to specific pages. For example, if you hover your cursor over the **Committee** link, a drop-down menu will appear from which you can select a specific committee page to visit. The committee pages contain a list of the committee members, information about the committee, and committee resources such as newsletters and informative documents.



To the right of the main navigation is the secondary navigation. “Buzzing” around there, the explorer will find links to chapter and state organization websites, the DKG Store and the DKG Network.

The middle section contains a variety of boxes, some with slide shows and dots that tell how many slide shows are currently available. In the **Announcements** box, each item is a link to useful items. One very useful item is a digital calendar for chapter leaders. Try it and see! Click a bar in the **Member Center** to access information described by the bar.

The bottom section of the website contains links to much more information including contact information, information about the Society, links to all of the forums and blogs, and much more. There are links to our social media pages and our Society publications. The area to log in for the DKG Network is in this bottom section. To be able to log in, your email address must be in the Society database. The initial login password for the DKG Network is Delta01#.

The Buzz about World Fellowship

The DKG International **World Fellowship** committee members have had a busy and rewarding biennium. They reviewed 75 applications submitted for the 2013-2014 grants, selected 23 recipients from 22 different countries to receive \$4000.00 each to pursue post-graduate degrees from American or Canadian universities. Ten talented women received extensions to previous awards.

The 98 applications for the 2014-2015 grants continued to challenge the committee as the personal stories and stated goals were inspiring. Nineteen recipients from 17 countries will receive \$4000.00 each with four extensions of \$1000.00 awarded. Committee members also reviewed the Form 41s submitted by state organizations, updated the World Fellowship information on the web, participated in Info Fairs at various regional conferences, and prepared for a workshop at the International Convention in Indianapolis.

World Fellowship is funded through donations. Through the generosity of DKG members, contributions from July 2012-July 2013 totaled \$79,236.97. \$180,200 has been awarded during this biennium. Funded fields of study include education, business, crime prevention, public health and nutrition, agriculture, human rights, technology, the sciences and the arts. Recipients will be taking a variety of skills back to their home countries. DKG is sharing our vision and impacting education worldwide!
