The highlight of the evening was presenting the \$500.00 scholarship to Elizabeth Miranda.













The passage of these bills provides for funding of our TRS pension fund to make it actuarially sound (making it possible for a possible cost of living raise in the future). On May 21st, two of our Nu members collaborated on a presentation to three high school classes in San Marcos. Rebecca Kroener invited Melynda Caudle to talk about Capital IDEA and careers in IT. The information focused on the benefits and services now available to graduating high school students in Hays county. The big idea is having students go to an orientation, determine if they qualify for services (there is an income test), and then get matched with a career navigator. Capital IDEA pays all costs for a two year degree across a number of specialties, including medical and IT, through Austin Community College. But more than paying for the costs this program includes ongoing and weekly support from the career navigator - the goal is not just starting college - it is finishing with a degree that will allow the graduate to start a career earning at least \$40K a year. The students were attentive and respectful and asked good questions. Rebecca said that some students who had not considered college an option approached her afterwards and seemed interested in the program.

Adjournment: President Rhodes adjourned the meeting at 7:10 p.m.


