

Tidbits and Activities!

Don't know where to start—I feel like I am stuck in a whirlwind. Suffice it to say we have had a lot to deal with these last few months. First it was (and continues to be) house repairs—the cracked septic, a new deck (because they couldn't get to the septic without tearing down the deck), a new roof (because it was time) and then exterior painting (again, because it was time).

My yearly physical showed all was well with me until the first mammogram in early February, revealed a 'slight irregularity' and necessitated another mammogram which showed a 'suspicion abnormality'. Sounding like the Twelve Days of Christmas song, I had three mammograms, two ultrasounds and a lumpectomy—the latter on March 11th at the hospital in San Marcos. At my March 18th followup, I was referred to an oncologist for radiation treatments, just to be on the safe side. I had ductal carcinoma in-situ. I have my initial appointment scheduled for Wednesday, April 3rd in San Marcos. They said I had to wait until the incision healed first. Everything happened so fast! I barely had time to prepare! To me that was better than dragging it out and building up worry!

My brother came to stay with Wes and drove us home from the hospital. Wes's cousin, who is a doctor/surgeon, reviewed all my reports, etc. and concurred with my doctor, so a second opinion was reassuring. He and his wife came up from Mexico.



Wes is still struggling with his problems. He had three appointments during this time, too. Latest is that his potassium levels are not normal. I took him for further tests last week. Now we wait.

I feel fine and my incision has healed nicely. I never had to take the pain pills prescribed—hooray! I am lucky for it all could have been much worse. Don't know what to except from radiation treatments, but I am praying for the best.

Easter was quiet and restful. A nice respite from all the goings on! Today, it was back to getting things ready for the painters. Lots of stuff had to be moved off the porches before they start.
