| 5 eggs | 1 1/4 cup shredded Cheddar cheese, divided | |
| 1/2 cup milk | 2 cups shredded potatoes | |
| 1/2 tsp. salt | 1/2 cup cooked ham, bacon or sausage | |
| 1/4 tsp. Pepper | 1 T dried parsley flakes | |
| 3/4 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese | | |

BREAKFAST PIE

Preheat oven to 350. In a large bowl, whisk together eggs, milk, salt, and pepper. Stir in shredded Monterey Jack cheese and 3/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese and set aside. Grease a 9" pie pan. In a separate bowl, toss together shredded potatoes and remaining 1/2 cup shredded Cheddar cheese. Press potato mixture into prepared pie pan to form a crust. Sprinkle cooked meat over crust. Pour egg mixture over meat. Sprinkle parsley flakes over pie. Bake for 35-40 minutes until pie is set. Serve hot or reheat in microwave before serving.
